Florida currently 32 NAWCA projects either completed or underway. These projects have conserved 100,025 acres of wildlife habitat. NAWCA funding of more than \$12.5 million stimulated partner contributions of over \$48.7 million. These figures do not include multi-state projects.

HICKORY MOUND IMPOUNDMENT ENHANCEMENT

The partnership will refurbish a 2-mile section of levee surrounding the Hickory Mound Impoundment. The impoundment, situated in the Big Bend Wildlife Management Area, contains 300 acres of palustrine forested wetland, 700 acres of estuarine intertidal marsh and 823 acres of live oak/Sabal palm hummocks and slash pine islands.

Approximately 11 acres of levees define the impoundment. Partners will install a new 2,000-foot spillway in the levee and will replace existing culverts with four box culverts. The remaining levee will be reshaped and stabilized. The project will enhance the impoundment by restoring water and salinity level management capabilities, giving the Florida Fish and Wildlife Commission the ability to conduct periodic drawdowns and controlled burns.
