Georgia has 17 NAWCA projects either completed or underway. These projects have conserved 67,412 acres of wildlife habitat. NAWCA funding of more than \$10.2 million stimulated partner contributions of over \$75.9 million. These figures do not include multi-state projects.

FLINT RIVER WMA WETLAND PROJECT

The purpose of the Flint River WMA Wetland Project is to restore 215 acres of bottomland hardwood wetlands on the Flint River WMA. This project is located in the Atlantic Coast Joint Ventures' Chattahoochee/Flint Rivers Focus areas, a key area for migratory waterfowl in southwestern Georgia.

Restoration work will include removing remaining pine trees, restoring hardwood and emergent wetland vegetation in selected areas, installing a functional water-control structure in the primary canal and managing the site through seasonal water level manipulation. Benefitted species include American black duck, mallard, wood duck, canvasback, redhead, ring-neck ducks and American wigeon.
