*Arizona has 10 NAWCA projects either completed or underway. These projects have conserved 6,144 acres of wildlife habitat. NAWCA funding of more than \$1.7 million stimulated partner contributions of over \$3.1 million. These figures do not include multi-state projects.*

## SANDHILL FARM RESTORATION PROJECT

The project area is located in the southeastern corner of Arizona in the Sulphur Springs Valley. Sandhill Farm is on 840 acres located approximately 20 miles north of the U.S.-Mexico border. The floor of Sulphur Springs Valley comprises a mixture of grazing lands, corn and alfalfa fields, while the valley sides are largely grazing lands. Sandhill Farm is particularly important for wintering waterfowl and sandhill cranes, as well as for breeding waterfowl, notably Mexican ducks. The goals of this project are to protect the wetland and upland habitat values on Sandhill Farm, restore seasonal emergent wetlands adjacent to Whitewater Draw, restore and enhance wetland associated upland habitats, and maintain the remaining quality and diversity of the Whitewater Draw floodplain habitat complex. These goals will be accomplished by placing a permanent conservation easement on the Sandhill Farm property; building several small semi-permanent and seasonal wetlands on the property; and restoring and enhancing native grassland. Northern pintail and mallard are among the waterfowl that occur at Sandhill Farm.
