*Arkansas has 19 NAWCA projects either completed or underway. These projects have conserved 91,759 acres of wildlife habitat. NAWCA funding of over \$13.7 million stimulated partner contributions of more than \$31.9 million. These figures do not include multi-state projects.*

## HURRICANE LAKE WMA GLAISE CREEK ENHANCEMENT II

This project is the second phase of an effort aimed at protecting, restoring and enhancing critical wetland habitats on public lands in the Mississippi Alluvial Valley (MAV) by leveraging private land conservation values perpetually protected in Mississippi, Louisiana and Arkansas. Primary conservation programs within the MAV aim to maintain and restore the landscape at a level that benefits both wildlife and people. There is an emphasis on increasing non-breeding period survival and subsequent breeding success of migratory birds that utilize this landscape as wintering and migration habitat.

This project is located in White County, Arkansas, adjacent to the White River, and consists of over 17,000 acres of prime bottomland hardwood habitat. This project will restore a more natural hydrologic function to the South Green Tree Reservoir (GTR) allowing the GTR to pulse more naturally and function as a true bottomland hardwood forest both saving the forest as well as providing water quality benefits downstream. This will be done through the installation of large spillways and structures in the existing levee of the south GTR to allow for a more natural flood pulse. Functioning hydrology is the foundation for maintaining forest integrity.
