Florida currently 42 NAWCA projects either completed or underway. These projects have conserved 143,693 acres of wildlife habitat. NAWCA funding of more than \$17.6 million stimulated partner contributions of over \$62.1 million. These figures do not include multi-state projects.

NORTH FLORIDA WETLAND CONNECTOR CONSERVATION II

This project is the second of a multi-phase effort to protect critical habitat for migratory birds and other wetland-dependent species in north central Florida through fee-simple purchases. This phase will preserve 3,940 acres of wetlands and adjacent uplands in eastern Alachua County, with the ultimate goal of preserving and connecting numerous small yet important wetlands throughout the region. As one of the nation's fastest growing states, Florida's rapid conversion of natural areas to agricultural, urban, and other land uses has caused the loss and degradation of critical habitat for breeding, wintering, and migrating birds including waterfowl, waterbirds, and neotropical migrants. Human encroachment and disturbance also threaten to adversely impact birds' ability to successfully breed, forage, and rest in what areas remain.
