KANSAS PRAIRIE WETLANDS VIII

This project will benefit critical habitat by acquiring, restoring and enhancing 12,856 total acres from several tracts that are on, or adjacent to protected lands including the Quivira National Wildlife Refuge, Smoke Valley Ranch Preserve, Melvern Wildlife Area, Clinton Wildlife Area, and Byron Walker Wildlife Area. The wetlands in this project provide important migration habitat for waterfowl, shorebirds, wading birds and other migratory birds, being utilized by an estimated 45 percent of the shorebirds in the Western Hemisphere during spring migration. This includes 90 percent of the white-rumped, Baird's, and stilt sandpipers, long-billed dowitchers and Wilson's phalaropes. This project will restore wetlands and provide a unique opportunity to convert po. It includes over 2,275 acres of wetlands that will be acquired, protected, restored, and/or enhanced, approximately 4,430 acres of conservation easements that will perpetually protect habitat on private lands in the Central Flyway, and the engagement of twelve partners, nine of which are new, that have pledged their support to preserve habitat and combat threats of habitat loss in Kansas. This project also includes several conservation easements on private lands, including a 3,530- acre conservation easement in Wallace County. This easement includes two parcels that will protect 298 wetland acres, including rare grassland playas and over 8 river and stream miles along both sides of the Smoky Hill River and several tributaries, as well as 2,323 associated upland acres, including unbroken shortgrass prairie imbedded with historic playa wetlands that were never plowed or quality cropland into wetland and upland habitat that can be enjoyed by the public. Species benefitted include least terns, piping plovers, mallards, northern pintails, wood ducks, king rails and American bitterns.

Kansas has 30 NAWCA projects either completed or underway. These projects have conserved 182,907 acres of wildlife habitat. NAWCA funding of more than \$22.6 million stimulated partner contributions of almost \$32.8 million. These figures do not include multi-state projects.
