ST. LAWRENCE RIVER / THOUSAND ISLANDS III

This project will protect thirteen tracts totaling 2,193 acres, restore 11 acres of wetlands, and enhance 2,516 acres of habitat for wetland dependent species in the 8,757-acre Upper and Lower Lake WMA. All of the properties that will be protected through fee title acquisition will be transferred to a local land trust, and will be managed specifically to maximize wildlife and habitat diversity. The project tracts collectively protect the following high-quality habitat: mature swamp forest, red maple swamps, Black Ash swamp, successional swamp forest, shrub wetlands, beaver floes, vernal pools, emergent wetlands along riverine shoreline fringe, and interior wetlands including isolated potholes. The diverse habitat supports an abundance of wildlife species including breeding, stopover and wintering habitat for priority waterfowl, shorebirds, waterbirds, raptors, and landbirds.

New York has 45 NAWCA projects either completed or underway. These projects have conserved 99,681 acres of wildlife habitat. NAWCA funding of more than \$14.6 million stimulated partner contributions of over \$61.4 million. These figures do not include multi-state projects.
