*Tennessee has 42 NAWCA projects either completed or underway. These projects have conserved 70,625 acres of wildlife habitat. NAWCA funding of more than \$14.2 million stimulated partner contributions of over \$71 million. These figures do not include multi-state projects.*

## WOLF RIVER WETLANDS: SOURCE TO CONFLUENCE

This project supports a decades-long initiative by the Wolf River Conservancy in partnership with state, federal and private partners to protect the upper river and restore the riparian forests along the lower river as a wildlife corridor, for drinking water recharge and for outstanding recreational and educational opportunities near the Memphis metropolitan area. The goal of Wolf River Wetlands: Source to Confluence is to protect in perpetuity 1,266 acres of wetlands and adjacent uplands along the Wolf River corridor in northwest Mississippi and southwest Tennessee through fee acquisition of 673 acres, fee donation of 209 acres and conservation easements on 384 acres. Of the total acres, 67% is wetlands on the Wolf River corridor within the far western boundary of the East Gulf Coastal Plain (1,097 acres) and the eastern portion of the Lower Mississippi Valley Joint Ventures (169 acres).
