Virginia has 35 NAWCA projects either completed or underway. These projects have conserved 77,388 acres of wildlife habitat. NAWCA funding of more than \$30.1 million stimulated partner contributions of over \$100.3 million. These figures do not include multi-state projects.

DELMARVA OASIS I

This project preserves or restores 459 acres of varying wetland habitats including over 400 acres of declining wetland types such as palustrine emergent, estuarine emergent and forested freshwater wetlands. In addition, this project protects 240 acres of mixed upland forest and 371 acres of other uplands. The project area is an important part of a major migration corridor in the Atlantic Flyway, which supports priority waterfowl species, neotropical migrants and other land birds, shorebirds, and wading birds. Examples of some priority bird species that will, or are likely to, benefit directly from the conservation actions described in this project include: Mallard, Northern Pintail, Lesser Scaup, American Bittern, American Oystercatcher, American Woodcock, Seaside Sparrow, King Rail, Short-eared Owl, Red-headed Woodpecker, and Worm-eating Warbler.
