TUALATIN RIVER BASIN - LOWER COLUMBIA RIVER ESTUARY REGIONAL PARTNERSHIP I

This project is the first of several emphasizing collaborative engagement of multiple partners focusing on wetland and riparian conservation within the Willamette Valley of western Oregon and the Lower Columbia River Estuary of southwestern Washington and northwestern Oregon. At the foundation of this multi-phased effort is an extensive network of riverine and estuarine floodplains comprised of diverse palustrine and estuarine wetlands and forested uplands that extend over a 712 square mile area encompassing the Tualatin River Basin, and nearly 400,000 acres within the Lower Columbia River Estuary. This initial phase will conserve 870 acres of nationally and regionally decreasing wetland types and associated forested uplands. The project focuses on restoring a multitude of habitats such as: palustrine emergent wetlands, seasonal wet prairies, estuarine emergent wetlands, seasonally flooded upland wetland buffers, estuarine salt marshes, forested riparian corridors, forested estuarine and freshwater uplands, mixed coniferous-deciduous and oak dominated uplands, and forested scrub-shrub habitat communities in both palustrine and estuarine systems.

Washington has 69 NAWCA projects either completed or underway. These projects have conserved 123,589 acres of wildlife habitat. NAWCA funding of more than \$29.6 million stimulated partner contributions of over \$136.8 million. These figures do not include multi-state projects.
