DU VOLUNTEERS BOOST ARIZONA WATERFOWL RESEARCH

In June, Arizona Ducks Unlimited volunteers partnered with the Arizona Game & Fish Department (AZGFD) to place neck collars and leg bands on Canada geese in Navajo County. This collaborative research effort will help AZGFD monitor movement patterns, survival, and population trends of local geese in the White Mountains.

In addition to on the ground support, DU also provided funding for rocket netting equipment that will allow AZGFD to launch its own state-wide duck banding program. This new program is scheduled to begin this winter and will expand Arizona's capacity to gather long term data critical to waterfowl management and conservation planning.
