DRUMMOND FLAT WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT AREA EXPANSION

Conservation efforts at Drummond Flat Wildlife Management Area (WMA) took a major step forward with the acquisition of three tracts totaling 377 acres, completed between September and December 2025. We worked alongside the Oklahoma Department of Wildlife Conservation (ODWC) on seller negotiations and provided a portion of the funding to help add these lands to the existing WMA. This successful project was made possible through strong partnerships with ODWC, Kodiak Cares Foundation, Horizon Foundation and Southern Prairies and Playas Initiative sponsors.

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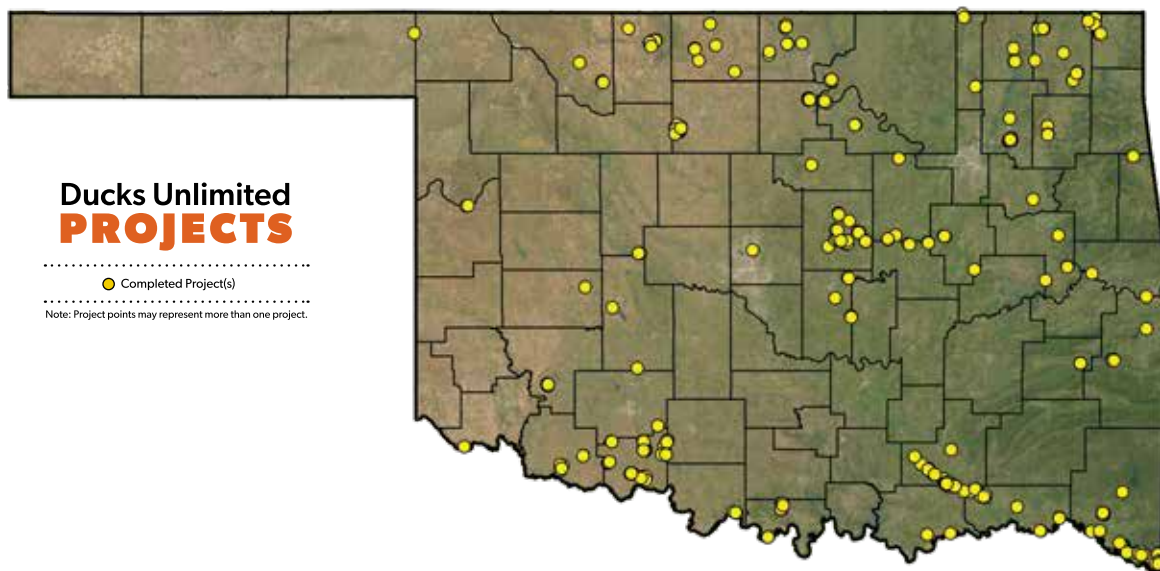
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
